## AMERICAN ROSE SOCIETY ANNOUNCES 'BEVERLY' AWARDED JAMES ALEXANDER GAMBLE FRAGRANCE AWARD

**SHREVEPORT, LA** – The American Rose Society announces the 'Beverly' was awarded the prestigious James Alexander Gamble Fragrance Award during a virtual Members' Meeting earlier this year. 'Beverly' is a pink blend hybrid tea with full petals (26-40). It was hybridized by Wilhelm Kordes III for the Kordes Rosen Company and introduced to the market in 2008. It presently has a 7.8 rating in the *ARS Handbook For Selecting Roses*, which makes it a solid to very good rose. The complete horticultural description from *Modern Roses* database: 'Beverly' (other names it goes by around the world: Sophie Davant, Perfume Passion, Pink Perfection), Hybrid Tea, Pink Blend; hybridized by Kordes; blooms 10, borne mostly solitary, regular repeat; strong fragrance,



semi-glossy foliage surface, medium green foliage color; upright growth, tall height; Patent# PP 23,495; Parentage: ['The McCartney Rose' X seedling]; introduced by Kordes Rosen, 2008.

The James Alexander Gamble Fragrance Medal is awarded to outstanding new, very fragrant roses. The selection is made by the ARS Prizes and Awards Committee for the rose considered the most fragrant in municipal and private gardens throughout the United States over a five-year period. The rose must be registered and must be rated at least 7.5 in the *Handbook for Selecting Roses*. It is not mandatory that a rose be selected yearly for this medal. The "new" rose must have received its registration within 15 years prior to the award, but not less than five years. Awards are only to be made when an outstanding new fragrant variety is available. The medal is to be awarded to the hybridizer of the named rose at the Fall Annual Meeting of the American Rose Society. A list of previous winners follows:
